


Homework and Study in 6th Year


How to stay Mentally Healthy this year

- There are supports here in school and also from outside agencies, please do reach out.






National Framework of Qualifications



PLCS



- Post Leaving Cert (PLC) courses are typically one or two year, module-based programmes of study, covering a wide range of subject areas.
- PLCs offer a QQI certification.
- PLC courses can also serve as an alternative way of <u>accessing a third level degree</u> course with almost 20% of all CAO applicants presenting a Level 5 or Level 6 PLC award to access these opportunities.





University in the UK-








Applications close for programmes in Netherlands with a 'numerus

- There are over 1000 undergraduate degree programmes in a full range of subjects in universities across Europe which are delivered through English.
- Entry requirements in many European universities are generally lower compared to Irish universities as they don't tend to use a points system.
- There are no, or low, tuition fees in many European countries.

- Academic Scholarships are normally awarded after the Leaving Certiticate results
